Formally called "Capacity-building in Learning and Knowledge Management for CBCRM Programmes and Sustainable Livelihood Initiatives in the Philippines", this three-year project hopes to continue and strengthen the activities on "resource pool formation" and Coastal Resource Management (CRM) Network.

At the Project's helm is Elmer M. Ferrer, Associate Professor at the CSWCD, Center's Coordinator and all-time advocate of CBCRM.
