Discovering ANDA

This island municipality lies at the Western portion of Lingayen Gulf in the province of Pangasinan. On the west across a narrow body of water known as the Kakiputan Channel is the municipality of Bolinao. The town of Bani is situated south west of Anda, while the town of Alaminos lies directly south.

In the 1800s, **Anda**, then known as Cabarruyan Island, used to be a barrio of Bolinao, Pangasinan, which was under the jurisdiction of Iba, Zambales. In the Pangasinan language, Anda may mean "to hand over".

The island was discovered by Andres Dela Cruz-Cacho known as Andales Kulayo but it's present name was in honor of Governor General Simon De Anda.

Anda CBCRMP Commences FRMP in Lingayen Gulf

The Anda Community-Based Coastal Resources Management Program has recently started the implementation of the Fisheries Resource Management Program (FRMP) Community Organizing Component in Lingayen Gulf Cluster 1 (Anda & Bani) in Pangasinan. The FRMP program covers 17 barangays of Anda and 2 more in Bani, Pangasinan.

The contract was signed between the CBCRM Resource Center/ UPSARDFI and the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) last December while the notice to proceed was given on January 15, 2001.

Resource Center to Conduct Forum on Population and CBCRM
